

Confidential Reliable Citizens Program

Do you feel helpless to prevent violent crimes from occurring? Are you sick and tired of drug dealers and users turning your neighborhood into an open air drug market? If you call the police, do you fear retaliation from the thugs who participate in unlawful gang activity? Do you wish the police and courts could do more to help you and your neighbors but you're afraid to get involved yourself?

There is something you can do! The Confidential Reliable Citizens Program (CRCP) allows you to report crime in your neighborhood confidentially. A police officer will not be dispatched to your home. When you become involved in the CRCP, you can provide instant information that the Tulsa Police Department can use to make arrests of drug dealers, gang members and other criminals. With this information, the Tulsa County District Attorney's Office or the U.S. Attorney's Office can effectively prosecute these individuals, hold them accountable for disrupting the peace and tranquility of your neighborhood, and force them to move on.

Background & Training

Citizens wishing to be part of the program agree to submit to a short background check conducted by the Tulsa Police Department and attend a two-hour training seminar. The emphasis of the training will be on recognizing those involved with drugs, gangs and violent crime.

Providing Confidential Information

to the Tulsa Police Department

Once you have gone through the training program, you will be assigned a code name/number. When you see criminal activity taking place in your neighborhood, you will be able to call 911, tell them your code name/number, and provide a detailed summary of what you are watching. The dispatcher will contact an available Officer who can respond and act on your complaint. If an arrest is made, the Tulsa County District Attorney's Office or U.S. Attorney's Office will take it from there, representing you and your neighborhood in court.

Why should I be a part of the Confidential Reliable Citizen Program?

This program allows law-abiding citizens, like yourself, the opportunity to safely fight back against crime in your neighborhood. You can confidentially call the police on crimes occurring outside your home.

The mission of the Crime Commission is to improve the safety and security of the citizens of Tulsa through crime prevention education, anti-violence programs, and public involvement. This is one more step in accomplishing this mission. Collaboration and partnership is paramount to making Tulsa a better place to live, work and play!

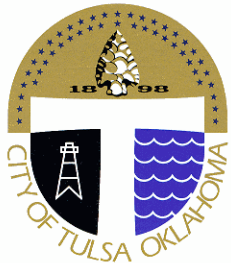

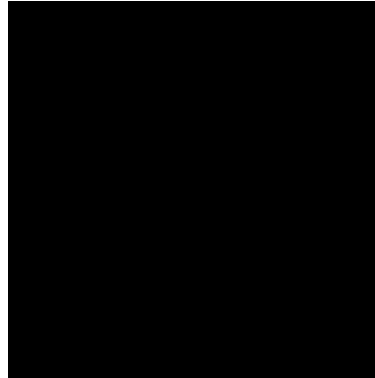
